



## TELECOMMS CSCS COURSE

### COURSE OVERVIEW

SHEA Telecommunications is provided by the Energy & Utility skills register (EUSR) this course is specifically for the telecommunications industry.

The Safety, Health and Environmental Awareness course is a skills sector card for the telecommunications industry. EUSR is a partner to CSCS meaning SHEA EUSR ID Cards carry the CSCS logo – giving the individual access to operational sites, that require a CSCS affiliated scheme. This course covers basic health and safety topics for telecommunication industry workers, including occupational hazards, safe working methods and relevant legislation.

On successful completion of the training, you will be registered onto the Energy & Utilities Skills Register, accessible for all via the EUSR website for quick recognition. All cards are now digitally issued by EUSR in line with reducing plastics. However for an additional charge a plastic card can be issued. Access to a portal also allows you to show your competence.

This card scheme is recognised by service providers like Virgin Media, Openreach and many others.

### WHO IS THE COURSE FOR?

This course is ideal for anyone requiring a CSCS card specific for telecommunications industry.

### COURSE CONTENT

This course consists of six core modules plus one specific module to the telecommunications industry. All individuals will need to complete all seven modules to receive the SHEA Telecommunications registration.

1. Understanding our workspace responsibilities in relation to Health and Safety
2. Understanding the effects of our work on the environment
3. Identifying and controlling risks using risk assessments
4. Identifying hazards in the workplace
5. Highway working and excavations
6. Occupational health hazards
7. Telecommunications

If you have an EUSR card already for GAS, Electric or Water you would only need to complete the telecommunications modules.

### ASSESSMENT

All delegates will need to complete 30 questions per module via an online examination and complete a practical assignment to pass. Homework is given out daily and must be completed prior to the final examination. This identifies strengths and weaknesses and allows the delegates to improve in areas of weakness with guidance from the tutors delivering the course.
